International Agreement and Terms of Cease Fire Between

The Republic of Texas and its Body Politic known as "We the People of The Republic of Texas"

Known Hereafter as Party 1

The State of Texas and its citizens of the United States operating as a Political Subdivision of the UNITED STATES Inc. its agencies, and departments, and as a member nation and founding principal of the United Nations

Known Hereafter as Party 2

Terms and Conditions

- I. The parties to this agreement hereby certify that they have the delegation of authority pursuant to their specific laws and constitutions under the law of nations to enter into and to execute the following international agreement and upon execution of agreement pursuant to the third clause of this agreement both parties shall present documents of authority or delegation to certify their ability to enter into this International Agreement.
- 2. That all parties hereby agree to a Toxas Wide Cease Fire including all those lands as specified in actions pursuant to Acts of the Congress of The United States involving a "Treaty with a Foreign Country", dated April 25, 1838, at US Stat. 511 and filed at the Congressional Record of the 104th Congress, Second Session of The United States, Tuesday April 30, 1996 at H4304 PETITION. ECT., Under clause 1 of rule XXII., 71. at Atticle Two of this Treaty, (Exhibit "1")
- 3. The First party hereby agree to a Formal International Cease Fire on the soil of Texas and agrees to immediately cease physical hostilities towards the second party under the law of nations and to commence legal actions in the District Court of The District of Columbia for the rights of the inhabitants on the soil of Texas to by popular vote decide issue of Texas independence.

Prest

4. The Second Party agrees that the First Party shall have the right to preserves its flag and embassy at is current location on Texas soil until the Third Section of this agreement may either be denied by the court, or by Popular vote of the People of Texas.
