sums shall be granted to the inhabitants of such townships for the use of schools.

Second, That the six miles reservation, including the salt springs, commonly called the *de la Poudre* salt springs, the salt springs near the *Washington* river, and in the military tract, with the sections of land which include the same, shall be granted to the said state for the use of the people thereof, the same to be used under such terms and conditions and regulations as the legislature of the said state shall direct; provided the said legislature shall renew or lease the same for a longer period than two years.

Third, That one twelfth part of the net proceeds of the lands lying within the said state, sold by Congress, from and after the thirtieth day of June next, after deducting all expenses incident to the same, shall be applied to the laying out and making public roads leading from the navigable waters emptying into the *Colorado* to the said state and through the same, such roads to be laid out under the authority of Congress, with the consent of the several states through which the same shall pass; provided, however, that the three foregoing provisions herein afforded are on the condition that the committee of the said state, shall provide by law or ordinance, irrevocable, without the consent of the United States, that every such road to be laid out by Congress from and after the thirtieth day of June next, shall be, and remain exempt from any tax, levy, by order or under authority of the States, whether for state, county, township or any other purposes whatever, for the term of seven years from and after the day of sale.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1

That the sum of one hundred and eighty thousand dollars, to be paid out of the Treasury of the United States, shall be distributed to the several States, Territories, and Possessions of the United States, as follows, to-wit:
