Note: The treaty was rejected by the U.S. Senate on June 8, 1844, by a vote of 16 to 35 (6 S. Ex. Journal 311-312). President John Tyler in his annual message to Congress on December 3, 1844, referred to one of the chief objections against the treaty "to consist in the fact that the question of annexation had not been submitted to the ordeal of public opinion in the United States." (4 Richardson 343). The annexation was effected by the Joint Resolution of the U.S. Congress of March 1, 1845 (Res. no. 8, 5 Stat. 797), and subsequent documents. For more information on the annexation of Texas, see 4 Miller 689-739. The original treaty, in English, is in the treaty file.
