



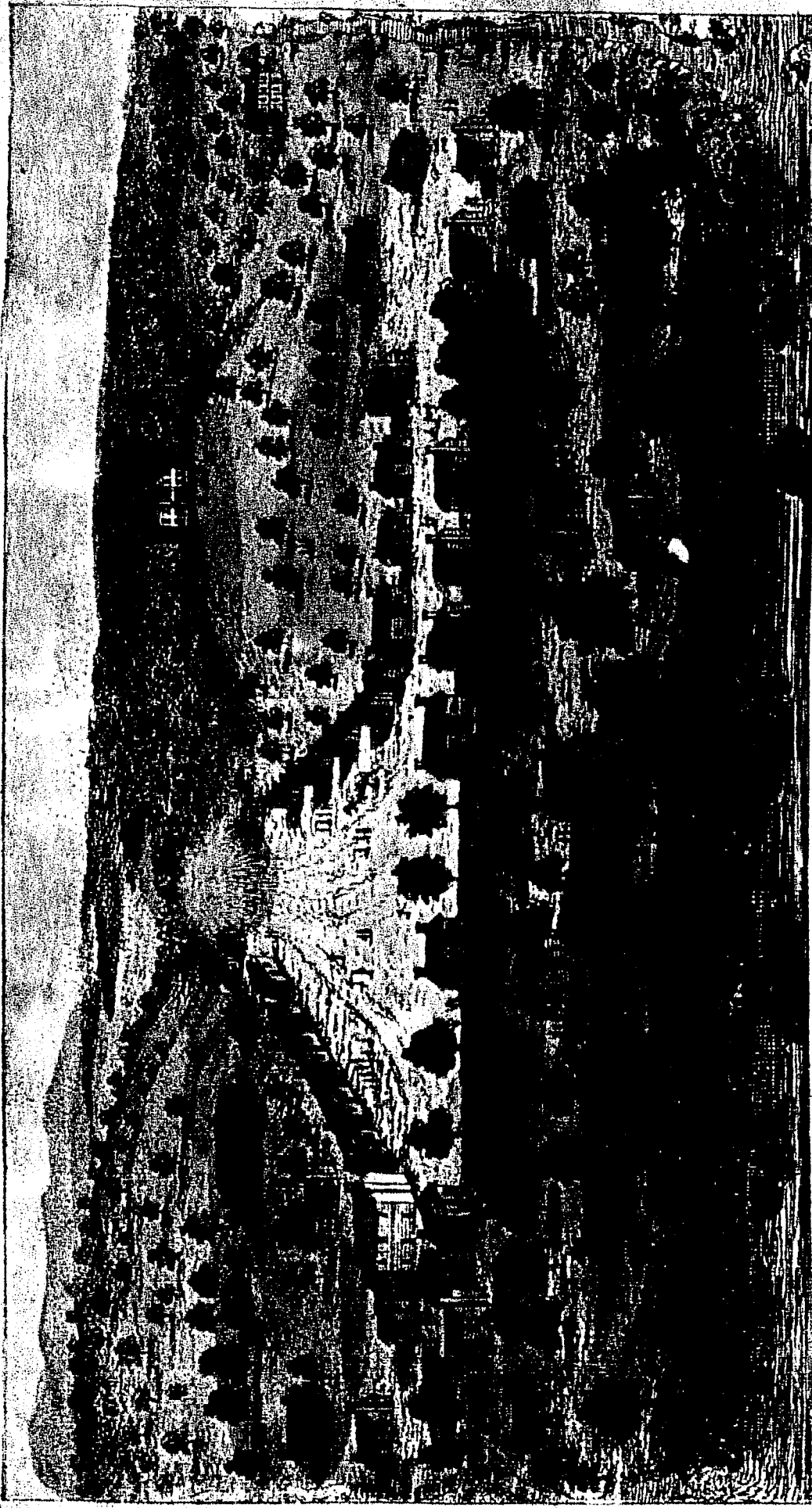

Speech

Deeply impressed with a sense of
 the responsibility devolving on me, I stand
 in justice to myself to express the emotions of
 my heart; or restrain the feelings which my
 sense of obligation to my fellow citizens has in-
 spired. Their suffrage was gratefully
 preferred to other, probably superior in merit to
 myself, called to the most important situation
 among mankind by the voice of a free people.
 It is utterly impossible not to feel impressed
 with the ^{deepest} feelings of dejection in my
 present situation before mankind. It
 is not here alone but our present attitude
 before all nations has rendered my position
 and that of the County one of peculiar interest.
 A spot of earth almost unknown to the Gen-
 tility of the Age, almost destitute of resources,
 few comparatively few in number, we ^{morally} ~~boldly~~
 to remonstrate against oppression; and when
 unaided by a numerous host, we dared to
 proclaim our independence and to strike for
 freedom on the heads of our oppressors. As yet
